

Call for Papers:

Two-Day Workshop on "Gender in the Academic Profession"

The Aarhus School of Business, University of Aarhus, Denmark.

September 17-18, 2007

Have we obtained gender equality within the academic profession? What affects career paths and are there gender specific differences in the promotion patterns? Is there "a leaking pipeline"? Does increasing female participation in higher education automatically decrease gender inequalities? How can economics answer these questions?

We invite papers presenting theoretical or empirical evidence on the labour market within the Academic profession. Relevant topics include, but are not limited to:

- Hiring processes
- Pay structure within the academic profession
- Career paths and promotion patterns
- Topical segregation
- other topics related to gender in Academia

Max. 10 papers will be selected for presentation. We welcome the submission of draft papers or extended abstracts in PDF format to sti@asb.dk. **The deadline for submission is June 1st, 2007.** Notification about acceptance will be given around June 15th.

The workshop is financed by The Nordic Centre of Excellence (NCoE) in Empirical Labour Economics. The workshop begins Monday afternoon. We arrange and pay for dinner (Monday), hotel accommodation for the night between Monday and Tuesday and lunch Tuesday. There is no conference fee. Participants have to arrange and pay for their own transportation.
